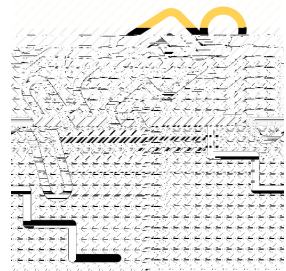




A building evacuation goes into effect in case of fire or other emergency that requires some or all occupants to immediately leave a building to ensure their safety.



How to prepare for a building evacuation:



Familiarize yourself with emergency stairwells, exit routes, and assembly areas for your primary location, as well as buildings that you frequent.



Know at least two (2) exits near your primary location.



If you have a preexisting or new disability or injury, let Pace University Security or a colleague in your office location know that you will require assistance in an evacuation.

Signals for evacuation:



For all buildings in Westchester, evacuation is necessary when a fire alarm is activated.



For all buildings in New York City, evacuation is necessary when announced by the Fire Safety Director (FSD) on the loudspeaker (PA system).



In some cases, a Pace University emergency alert will go out to announce evacuation. This will be in addition to the fire alarm and/or FSD announcement.

Actions to take during severe weather emergency:

Always evacuate to the nearest accessible stairwell (or alternate if nearest exit is blocked or congested).

DO NOT use elevators during an evacuation.

Stay calm. Do not rush or panic.
